WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE MUSIC?

Music is an exciting course that is suitable for all types of musicians and learners. It is a varied course that develops skills in several areas and follows on effectively from both GCSE Music and BTEC Music (level 2). We have a history of students progressing to study music at conservatoires and universities after completing this course.

WHAT IS THE COURSE STRUCTURE LIKE?

The course is a <u>two year</u> course. It consists of four units, three of which are mandatory, with the final one chosen from a list of options. Two units are externally assessed and two units are internally assessed.

Performance



It is essential that you keep up your **practice** on your instrument.

Performance is a mandatory part of the course and so you must ensure that your skills are kept sharp over the coming months.

Instrumental Tuition

If you would like to have instrumental tuition when you start in Year 12 then <u>please get in touch and let us know.</u> Sessions are arranged to run alongside your academic lessons and are usually taught in free periods, at lunchtime or before/after school.







Music Theory, **Notation** and **Harmony** are also mandatory content on this course. As a starting point, you should be familiar with:

- > Treble and bass clef notation
- > Key signatures
- > Time signatures
- > Major and minor scale construction
- > Forming chords
