CACHE Level 3 Extended Diploma (3 x A-Level equivalent)

Aims of the course:

The aim of the course is to enable students to develop an understanding of working with people with specific needs. Work experience is integral to the course and gives students the opportunity to put theory into practice whilst allowing students to also develop the skills necessary for a future career within the Health or Social Care sector. Students will develop independent research skills and are encouraged to reflect on their attributes and own professional development throughout the course.

What are lessons like?

Students receive engaging input lessons that involve discussion, group work and presentations. A portfolio of coursework for each unit studied is then required, allowing students to develop excellent organisational and independent research skills.

Compulsory Units Studied

In order to achieve the CACHE Level 3 Extended Diploma in Health and Social Care (VRQ), you must achieve 14 mandatory units from Group A, 3 units from Optional Group 1 and 1 unit from Optional Group 2. You will also sit a controlled assessment in Year 12 and a controlled assessment and external exam in Year 13.

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Optional units will be chosen by your class teachers. These will further increase your knowledge and understanding of the health and social care sector as you will study topics including Mental Health, Dementia, The role of Play and Complementary Therapies.

Work experience placements

The course includes a **compulsory** placement requiring **175 hours** of work experience in different settings over the two years, for which a full DBS check will be carried out. This will give you the opportunity to put theory into practice and enable you to bring together learning from other units of study.

How you will be assessed

The course is assessed over 19 units over two years, in two ways: formal extended assessment and internally assessed coursework (subject to external verification). Students must undertake one Examination in Anatomy and Physiology and Two Controlled Assessments.

Where can this course lead to?

This course enables students to progress onto university or to start an apprenticeship or career in Health and Social Care.

Students have in the past studied for a degree in nursing, midwifery, social work, education studies, psychology, primary teaching, early childhood studies and occupational health – to name just a few! Alternatively, students may wish to pursue a career within a health or social care setting
