Even before staring at St Mary's, the Music Department were very supportive of my studies, offering me the chance to attend their SMArts Festival in 2017 to perform with Jess Gillan. At SMC I had the opportunity to perform in both the orchestra and the choir as well as in the band for the annual musical theatre production. I was also very fortunate to perform a movement of the Mozart Clarinet Concerto with the visiting Danum Camerata, an event which was arranged specifically to give advanced students the chance to perform concertos alongside an orchestra. I also had chance to develop my leadership and teaching skills, often being able to lead rehearsals, which enabled me to developed my conducting skills too. Additionally, I arranged some of the pieces that were performed as part of the annual 'Music Caravan' which led me to develop skills which I have been able to carry forward to my degree.

On applying for Music College:

The process of applying and auditioning for a Conservatoire was made so much easier because of the continual support of Music Department staff; whether this was supporting my application with references, accompanying me in practice sessions, arranging extra tuition or just being on hand to talk things through, there was always someone there to support me every step of the way. Campbell says:

Moving to London and the Guildhall has been life-changing. I've had the chance to watch and play with some of the big names in the industry as well as receiving tuition from world class educators. My usual day involves 3+ hours of private practice alongside classes, rehearsals, recording sessions and attending gigs. My advice to anyone considering pursuing Music seriously would be to trust your gut and go for it. The greatest thing I've learnt over the last year is to trust myself and commit fully to whatever I do. It may seem scary but if you have a passion for any creative practice then invest in yourself and you will go far.

On St Mary's:

I really feel like SMC gave me an environment in which I could discover the deeper workings and meanings of Music, a 'safe space' where mistakes and wrong turns were simply treated as part of the learning journey. I felt like my teachers really invested in me personally and gave me the confidence to trust my instincts and pursue my dream.

On the Associate Artist programme:

Working with Rob Barron (acclaimed jazz musician and SMC alumni) was an incredible opportunity which really kickstarted my move down to London. Rob is an amazing musician and brilliant educator and the experience of working with him was invaluable.
