WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE LAW?

Studying Law gives students an understanding of the role of Law in today's society and raises their awareness of the rights and responsibilities of individuals. By learning about legal rules and how and why they apply to real life, students also develop their analytical ability, decision making, critical thinking and problem-solving skills. All these skills are highly sought after by higher education and employers.

WHAT IS THE COURSE STRUCTURE LIKE?

The course is a <u>two year</u> course. It is assessed by **three 2-hour exams (criminal law, tort law and contract law)**. All exams will be taken at the end of your second year.



<u>Paper 1</u> – The Criminal Law & English Legal System

In this paper, you will study a range of criminal offences and defences to crimes:

Murder, Manslaughter, the non-fatal offences against the person, theft, robbery, self-defence, intoxication, insanity, loss of control, diminished responsibility, automatism, duress.

You will also study some English legal system topics:

The Judiciary, Solicitors, Barristers, Judicial precedent, statutory interpretation, Juries, Magistrates, Funding.



<u>Paper 2 – The Law of Tort and The English Legal System</u>

In this paper, you will study a range of 'Torts' (an area of civil law) Negligence, Psychiatric harm, Pure economic loss, Occupiers' Liability, Private Nuisance, Rylands v Fletcher, Vicarious Liability

You will also study some English legal system topics:

The Judiciary, The civil courts, The Law Commission, Parliamentary Law-making, Funding, Alternative dispute resolution.



<u>Paper 3 – Contract Law and The English Legal System</u>

In this paper, you will study a range of elements of Contract Law:

Offer, Acceptance, Consideration, Intention to Create Legal Relations, Misrepresentation, Economic Duress, Consumer Rights Act 2015, Exclusion clauses

You will also study some English legal system topics:

The Judiciary, The civil courts, Funding, The rule of law, European Union law, Delegated Legislation




