Why choose A level in Spanish?



A Level Spanish is a challenging but rewarding course to choose, and one that will provide intellectual stimulus alongside opportunities to develop, both personally and linguistically, during your continued education at St Mary's College. Choosing A level allows you to move towards fluency in the language, at the same time as broadening your knowledge of Hispanic countries and culture. You will study a range of topics such as art, heritage, cinema, politics, immigration, making the course engaging and diverse.

Spanish is spoken widely across the world; it is the official language of 20 countries and of course, it is the fastest growing language in the USA. The opportunity for future travel and employment are also something to consider.

You will find the course enriching and gain real satisfaction from being able to truly express yourself in Spanish with increasing fluency as you move through your studies.

COURSE STRUCTURE

- This is a 2 year course which will be assessed via <u>3</u>
 <u>exams</u> at the end of Year 13, details of which can be found later on in this presentation.
- In <u>Year 12</u> you will cover <u>6 topic areas</u> and the indepth <u>study of a film.</u>
- In <u>Year 13</u> you will do a <u>further 6 topics</u>, as well as learning how to read and <u>analyse a novel in</u> <u>Spanish.</u>
- The exams will assess your knowledge and skills in all 12 of the topic areas studied during Year 12 and 13, and you also write an essay on the film and book.
- For the speaking exam you are also required to complete an independent research topic with a Hispanic theme and present it in the exam.
- At the end of the course you will be awarded an A level graded from A*-E.

PAPER 1

Duration: 2 hours 30 minutes

Marks: 100

Percentage of total A level: 50%

<u> Paper 1:</u>

This is a combined listening, reading and translation exam in which you will be tested on all 12 of the A level topics from the 2 year course.

<u>Questions 1-4:</u> listening section

<u>Questions 5-8</u>: reading section

<u>Question 9</u>: translation from English to Spanish

<u>Question 10</u>: translation from Spanish to English. PAPER 2

Duration: 2 hours

Marks: 80 (40 for each of the 2 essays)

Percentage of total A level: 20%

Paper 2:

In this exam you have to write 2 essays; one on the book you have studied and one on the film. PAPER 3

Duration: 5 minutes preparation time, 16-18 minutes exam approx.

Marks: 60

Percentage of total A level: 30%

<u>Paper 3:</u>

This is the speaking exam. There are 2 sections to complete.

<u>Section 1</u>: you are given 5 minutes to prepare a stimulus card on one of the Year 12 or 13 topics. You will then be required to discuss this topic for 5 minutes with the examiner.

<u>Section 2:</u> in this part of the exam, you have to present a project that you will have spent time researching and preparing beforehand. You choose the title of this research project, the only stipulation being that it must be linked to the culture or society of a Hispanic country.
