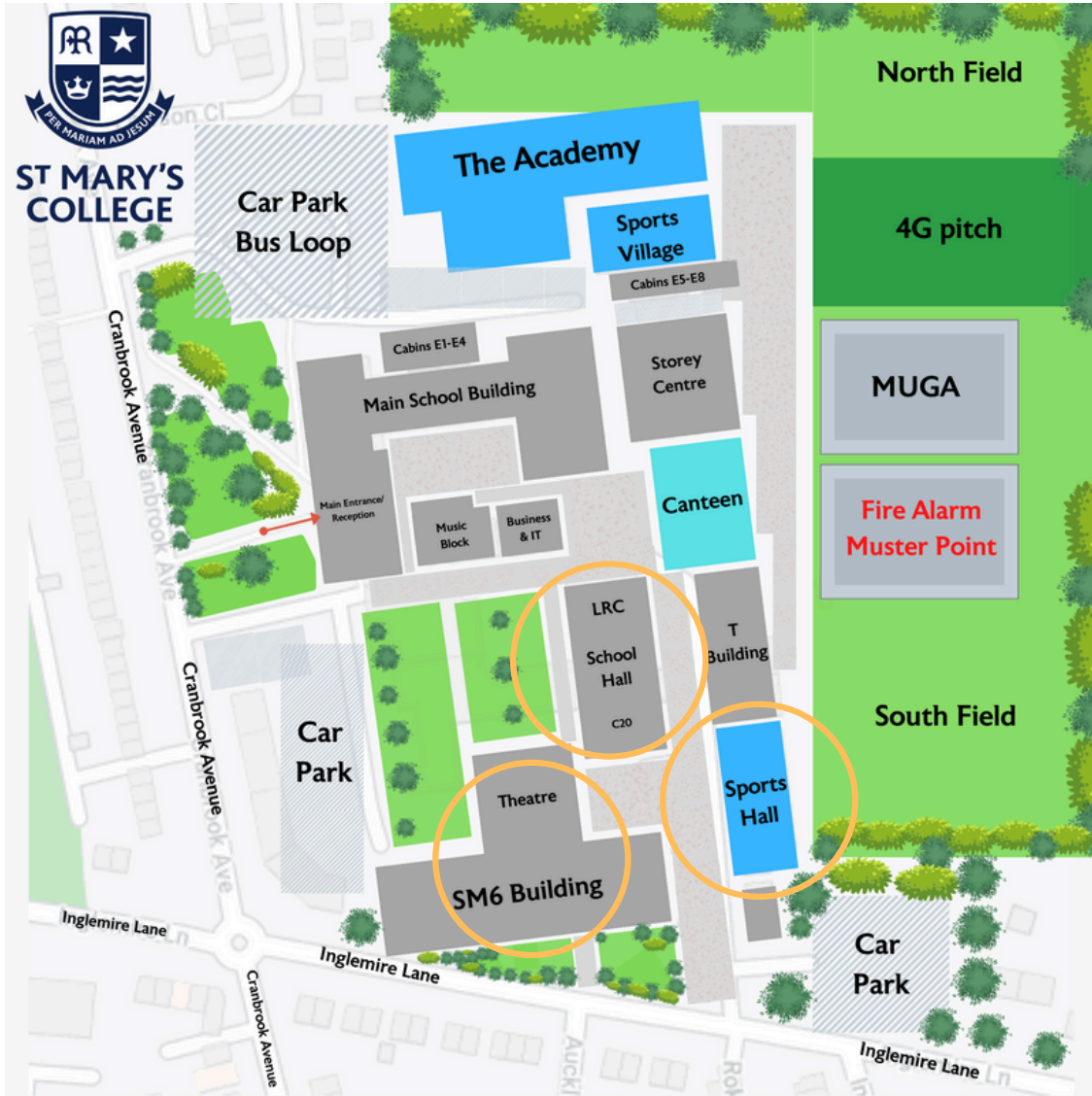

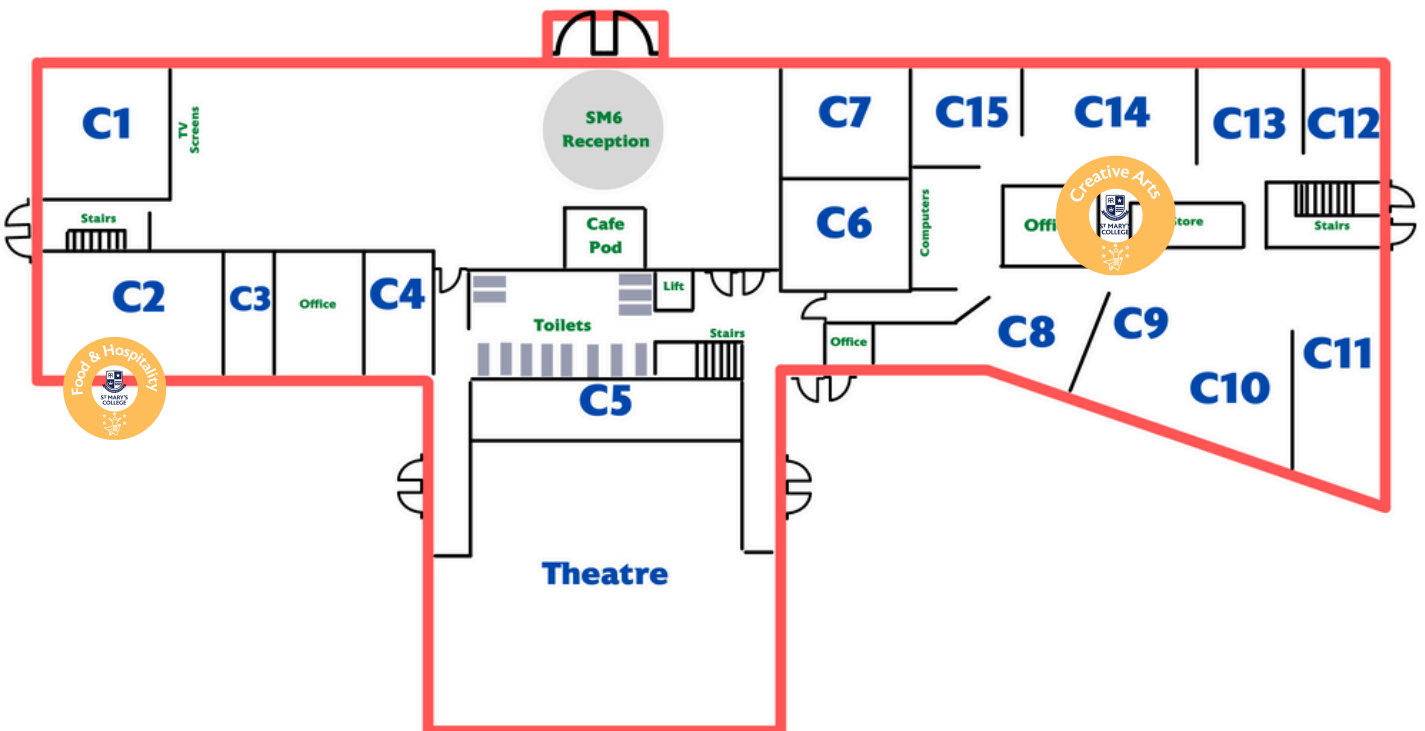

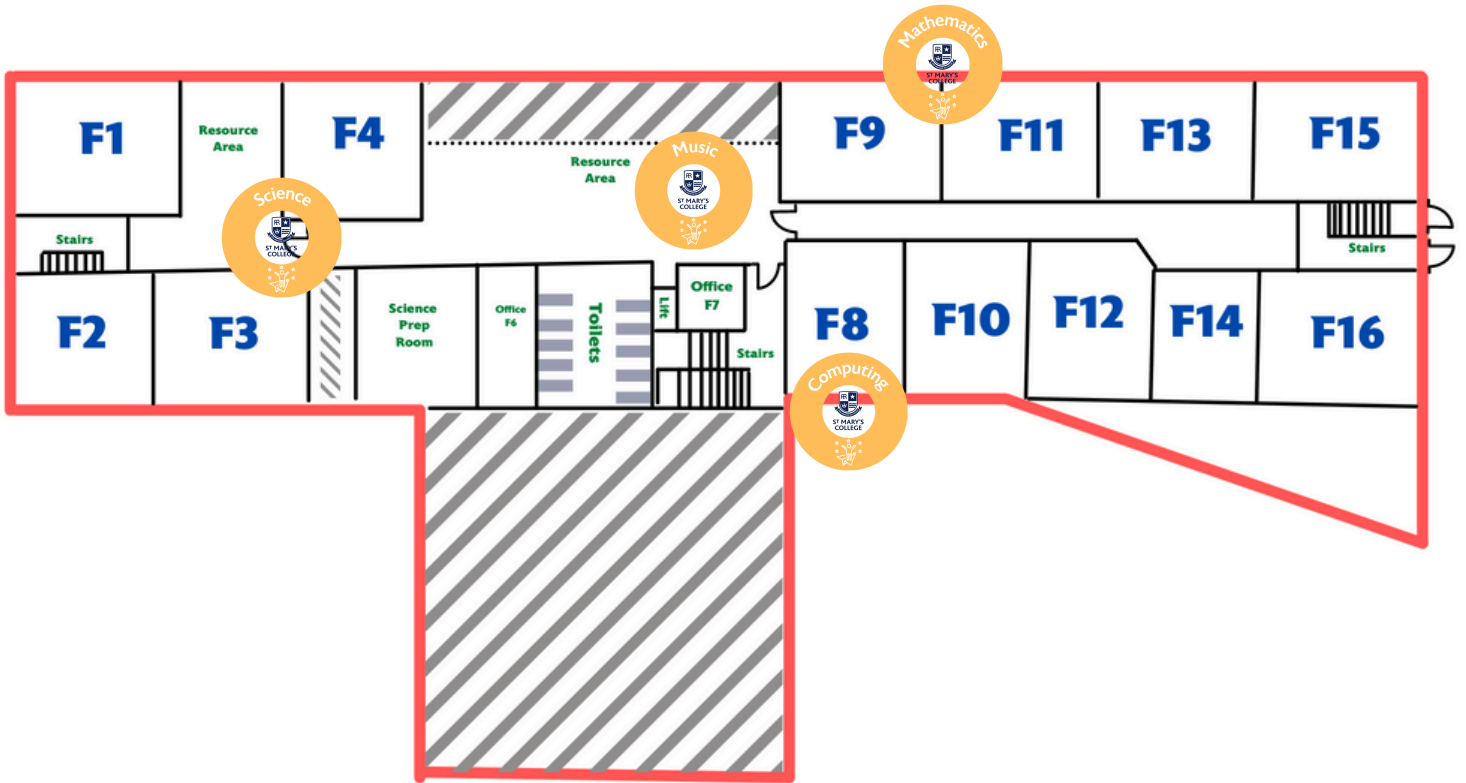
Maps and locations



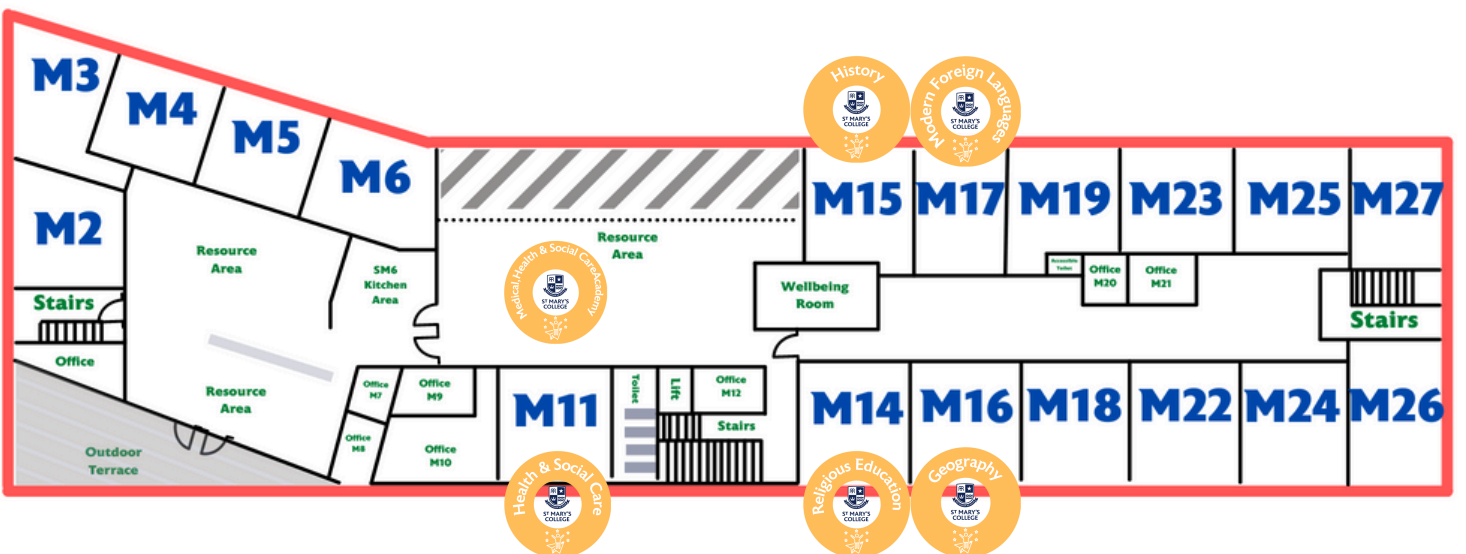
SM6 Ground Floor



SM6 First Floor

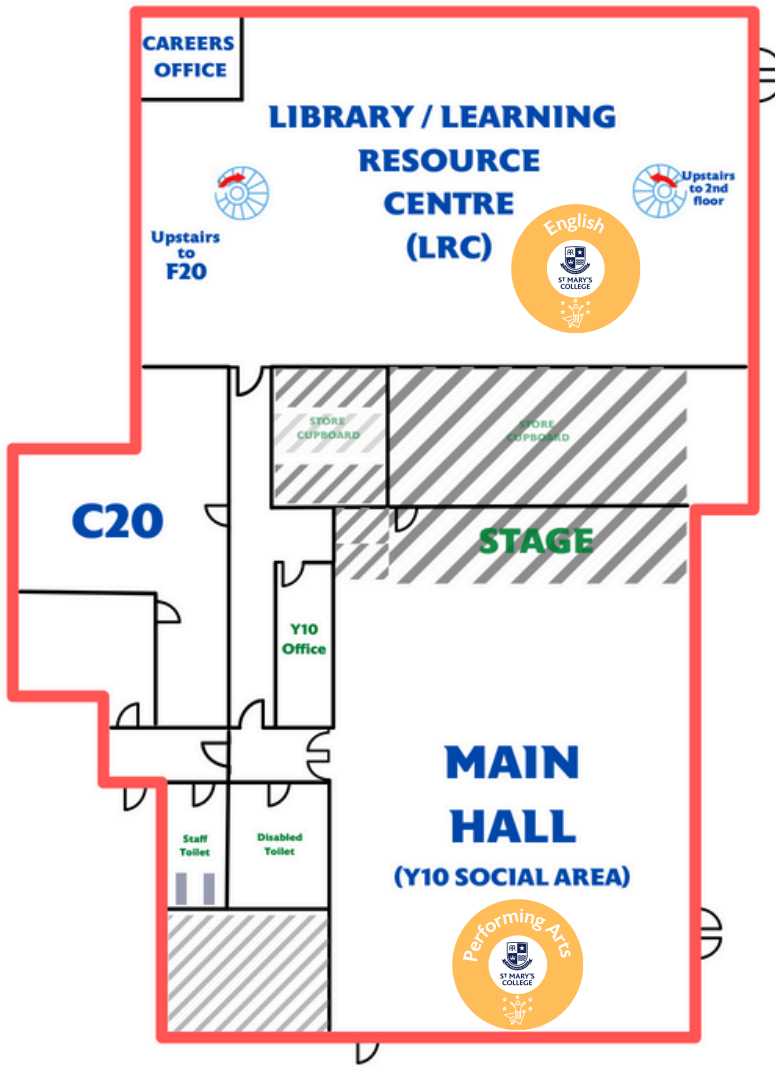


SM6 Second Floor





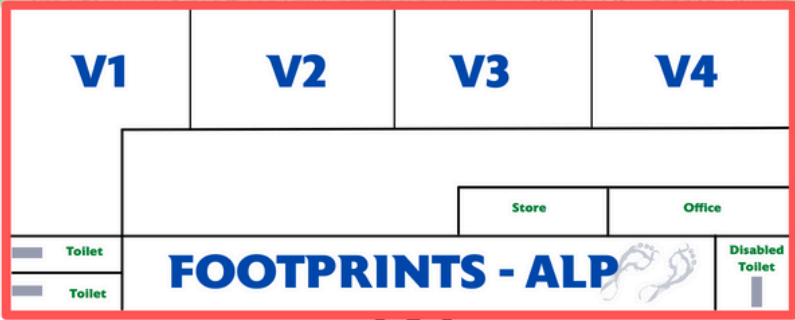

Admission Arrangements 2025
St Mary's College
(Part of St Cuthbert's RC Academy Trust)

SCRCAT is the admission authority and has responsibility for admissions to this school. The local authority undertakes the co-ordination of admission arrangements during the normal admission round. The Trust Board has set its published admission number (PAN) at 360 pupils to Year 7 in the school year which begins in September 2025.

Pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan

The admission of pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan is dealt with by a completely separate procedure. Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan that names the academy must be admitted. Where this takes place before the allocation of places under these arrangements this will reduce the number of places available to other children. The exception to this is where admitting the child would be incompatible with the provision of efficient education for other children, and where no reasonable steps may be made to secure compatibility.

Oversubscription Criteria

At any time where there are more applications for places than the number of places available, places will be offered according to the following order of priority:

1. Catholic looked after and previously looked after children (see notes 2&3)
2. Other Catholic children (see note 3)
3. Other looked after and previously looked after children (see note 2)
4. Catechumens and members of an Eastern Christian Church. (see notes 5&6)
5. Children who have a sibling at St Mary's College (see note 9)
6. Children of staff (see note 10)
7. Children with a proven aptitude in Music (see note 11)
8. Children of other Christian denominations from our named feeder academies (see notes 4 & 7)
9. Other children from our named feeder academies (see note 4)
10. Children of other Christian denominations and children of other faiths whose membership is evidenced by a minister of religion or other religious leader (see notes 7 & 8)
11. Any other children.

Tie Break

Priority will be given to children living closest to the academy determined by the shortest distance. Distance will be measured [by the shortest walking route] from the front door of the child's home address (including flats) to the main entrance of the academy, [using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system], with those living closer to the academy receiving the higher priority.
